Registration will be available online as of May 16, 2022.

Registration for up to seven weeks of Summer Program (5 weeks of day program, 2 vacation weeks) can be made **on a first come, first serve basis**.

In the interest of participants' safety and support, EAFWR Summer Program offers a 4:1 ratio. A questionnaire will be included in the registration confirmation to determine if 1:1 support is required. Any additional support required is the responsibility of the individual/family.

## Payment Options

Payments for each week of Summer Program are due at the time of registration.

Payments can be made through DIRECT WITHDRAWAL from your SSAH / Passport funding (**this option applies ONLY to families who receive funding through Extend-A-Family Waterloo Region**), BY CREDIT CARD, VISA DEBIT OR ELECTRONIC CHEQUE.

**If you plan on using your SSAH / Passport funding, a coupon code will be emailed to you closer to the registration open date.**

If you do not have funding left, you can still complete your registration and online payment with credit card through My Community Hub.
