



ADULT PROTECTIVE SERVICE WORKER & DSO Housing Navigator Expansion Project

Purpose of the Program:

The Ontario government (Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services - MCCSS) is investing in support for individuals with developmental disabilities who wish to live more independently in the community.

Who can Access the Program?

Adults with developmental disabilities who have lower support needs (based on their Supports Intensity Scale, who are living with a caregiver(s) (55 years+) and on the Developmental Services Ontario (DSO) Supported housing registry and want to live more independently in the community

What Kind of Support is Received Through this Program

DSO Housing Navigators:

- Help people with a developmental disability and their families and/or caregivers navigate the DSO housing toolkit
- Provide information about housing options in the community
- Host webinars and a workshop series to support the creation of housing and support plans
- Provide opportunities to meet others (virtually or in person) who are on a similar journey and/or who may be looking for partners
- Provide information and resources about services and programs in the community
- Advocate for the housing needs of people with a developmental disability

An APSW can assist with:

- Looking for housing, but do not provide housing
- Informal budgeting, money management, linking with money management professionals
- Linking with medical and dental services
- Linking with legal services, parenting support, advocacy regarding child protection services
- Linking with mental health professionals and services
- Developing supports with family/ friends and community and supportive counselling
- Finding social, recreational, and skill building activities



Resources we Provide

- A list of services and resources available to people, both ministry and non-ministry funded
- Self-assessments and questionnaires to help people decide their housing goals and preferred housing types
- Success stories from those who have created innovative housing options
- Contact information for family support networks and ways to find housing partners
- Access to the DSO Housing Toolkit


